Impact: Research

Since 1991, ACS has invested \$3.1 billion in cancer research nationwide contributing to 3.5 million fewer cancer deaths.

Impact: Advocacy

The American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network (ACS CAN) is making cancer a top priority for public officials and candidates at the federal, state, and local levels.



Standing Up for Cancer Patients

ACS CAN successfully advocated for historic legislation that will improve early detection of lung cancer by **eliminating patient cost-sharing** for lung cancer screening, and will ultimately save more lives.



Historic Increases in Cancer Funding Commitments to New York

ACS CAN successfully advocated for nearly **\$20 million** to provide lifesaving breast, cervical and colorectal cancer screening and treatment for low income uninsured women and men, and over **\$39 million** to reduce the deadly toll that tobacco takes on New Yorkers.
