# LITERACY PARADE & CHILDREN'S BOOK FESTIVAL

The Return: September 10, 2022





Early in the pre-Covid period, a group of Southside community members (the committee) initiated an effort to bring back the Light a Candle for Literacy Parade, first held in 2006. The parade and festival were initiated by reading and education advocate Geneva Hayden, a long-time Southside resident of Syracuse.

After many months of planning, the day arrived with great expectations.

Light a Candle for Literacy (LACFL) is a meaningful and symbolic expression. Over the entry to the Carnegie Library in Dunfermline, Scotland (the first Carnegie Library in the world) is a bas-relief and the biblical expression, "Let there be light." Light represents having one's eyes opened to knowing or knowledge.

Reading is the switch that turns on the light. En<u>light</u>enment is the result of learning and shedding light on knowledge.

Throughout history, being forbidden to learn to read and write was a way for oppressors to keep people oppressed. So, the selection of our name was meaningful and relevant.

### The Return of LACFL:

The day began with a parade starting at Beauchamp Library led by our Co-Grand Marshalls, Geneva Hayden, event founder, and Ruth Colvin, founder of Literacy Volunteers 60 years ago.

The parade was a wonderful celebration of a grassroots effort to promote children's learning and success in school. In addition, to the Grand Marshalls, it included community members, Mayor Ben Walsh, NY State Senator John Mannion (an event sponsor), the Syracuse Fire Dept, local mascots (Oakie the Acorn from ESF, Syracuse Crunch man), Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Library staff, Save the Rain float, a puppeteer on stilts, children in costume, and many more.

The parade ended at Brighton Academy (formerly Danforth School), where the festival began at 1 pm. The Syracuse Parks and Recreation bandwagon was the stage for the presentation by Mayor Walsh of the Joint Proclamation by him and County Executive Ryan McMahon (right) and continuous music and live entertainment.





Inside the school auditorium, cafeteria, and many of the classrooms were the many exhibitors and demonstrations, including Bubble man, a puppet show, food (provided by Tops Friendly Markets as they had at each previous event), face painting, Princess Tiana and valuable information for parents and children.

Exhibitors included: Upstate Medical University, Upstate Stroke & Pharmacy, Environmental Science & Forestry (ESF), LeMoyne College, YMCA, the MOST, Onondaga County Health Dept Lead Poison Control, United Way, Early Childhood Alliance, Operation Northern Comfort...and many more.



### **Passport Required!**

Children were given our version of a passport which required them to visit five (5) or more exhibits in order get a free book(s).

Operation Northern Comfort also offered bookcases to provide a place for books in children's homes.

The presence of fifteen children's book authors and illustrators (including a teenaged author) for storytelling was a high point of the festival.




This event was much needed after the learning losses due to the disadvantages many urban students suffered from COVID and distance learning.


