FIELDING YOUR TEAM

Each company team will compete within one of five divisions based upon that company's total number of San Antonio-based full-time and part-time employees.

Division 1: 1,000 or more employees

Division 3: 150-399 employees

Division 5: Up to 74 employees

Division 2: 400-999 employees

Division 4: 75-149 employees

All team members must be at least 18 years of age and a full-time or part-time employee of the company and may compete for only one company.* Team members may participate in more than one event, but competitions will not be delayed waiting for participants.

Teams are subject to forfeiture of an event and a 25-point deduction from their total score if they enter a person who is not on the official entry form or does not meet the employee eligibility rules. In the event of a participant challenge, both the employee and a company official must be prepared to confirm identification.

**Division 5 companies may also join forces with another small company to compete together. Combined, the total number of employees must still be 74 or fewer.*

HOW TO WIN

Six San Antonio charities will be the beneficiaries of donations accumulated from participating teams, with points being awarded toward the cup. Haven for Hope, South Texas Blood & Tissue, University Health Blood Donor Services, the YMCA, Boys and Girls Club of San Antonio and San Antonio Sports will all be accepting and recording donations **through May 15, 2026**. Each charity will rank participating teams, within their respective divisions, in order of their donated amounts, after which San Antonio Sports will award points toward competition. CHARITY CHALLENGE OVERVIEW



1 BLOOD DONATION CAN SAVE 3 LIVES



Six San Antonio charities will be the beneficiaries of donations by participating company teams. Haven for Hope, YMCA, South Texas Blood & Tissue, Boys & Girls Clubs of San Antonio, University Health Blood Donor Services and San Antonio Sports will all be accepting and recording donations from January 1 - May 15.

Donations must be made directly to each charity, not through any partner agencies or through any third-party donations, i.e. The Big Give. Only employee donations will count. Up to two times an employee's donation through a company match will count, but company grants cannot be converted to Corporate Cup points. There are two blood donation charities. Cumulative points will be awarded for blood donations based on the total number of donors.

Each charity will rank participating teams, within their respective divisions, in order of their donated amounts, after which San Antonio Sports will award points towards the overall Corporate Cup competition. Please make sure you specify Corporate Cup when setting up your drive so the charities have an accurate count.

New to this year's event, teams will have an exclusive opportunity to register and donate in person to our six charities at the March 28 5k. Location to be determined and more information coming soon.

CHASE TEAM TAILGATE UNLOADING

Friday, May 29 - 9 a.m. - 4 p.m.

Vehicles needing to unload will follow the main roadway down the hill where they will turn right at the first stop sign at the bottom of the hill near the football stadium. Proceed ahead underneath the visitor's side of the football stadium until you see the large, bronze Cardinal statue on the right side. From there a volunteer or staff will direct you into designated tailgating zones. No vehicle access to tailgate zones will be allowed on Saturday, May 30.

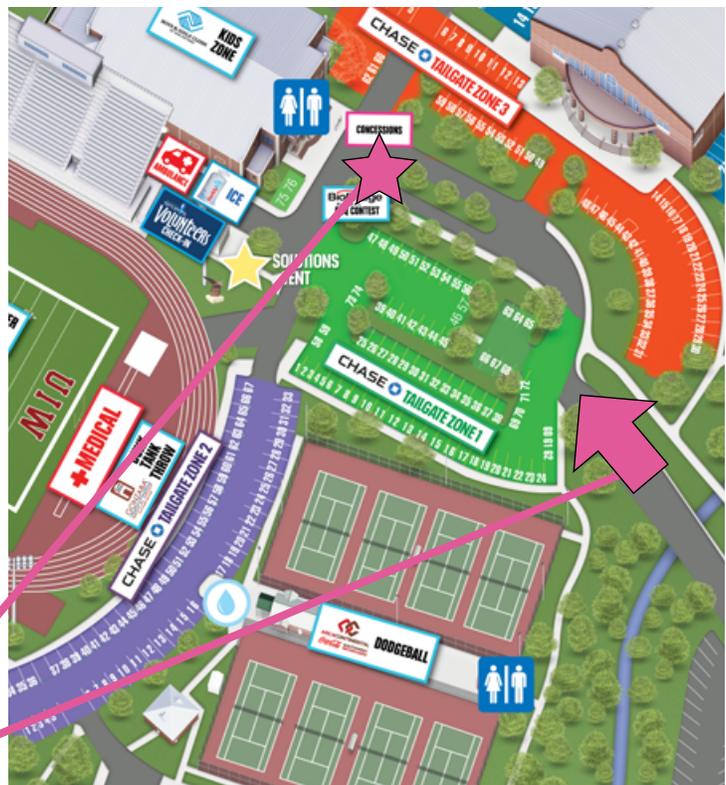
ROAD CLOSURE - SATURDAY, MAY 30

UIW FEIK SCHOOL OF PHARMACY AND INCARNATE WORD HIGH SCHOOL

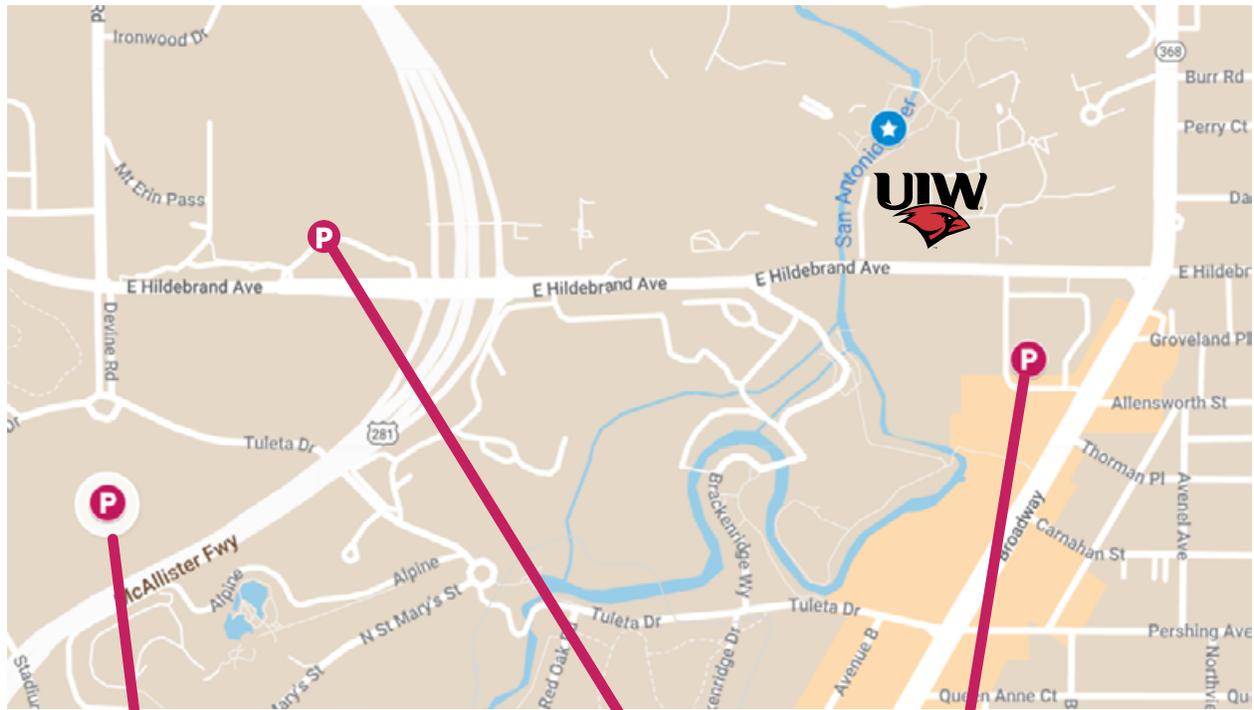
This lot is on the west side of 281, just off Hildebrand (232 spaces) and is located between the pharmacy school and Incarnate Word High School (50+ spaces). There is also parking at Incarnate Word HS. There is a pedestrian walkway connecting the high school campus and university campus that goes over Highway 281. The entry to the pedestrian walkway is toward the front of the high school campus, on the southeast area of IWHS. When you cross over the walkway, to the east side of 281, you'll be on the campus of UIW... simply walk down the hill to your left to Benson Stadium.

VIP PARKING

Available behind and adjacent to the UIW Natatorium and can only be accessed by a special VIP parking pass provided by San Antonio Sports. Parking pass will be required.

OFF-CAMPUS PARKING OPTIONS



ALAMO STADIUM PARKING LOTS: These lots are by Alamo Stadium football field, off Stadium Drive, directly across from the entrance to Trinity University. Exit Hildebrand off 281 and drive west. Take the first left onto Stadium Drive. At the bottom of the hill, turn right and go up the hill. These parking lots will be on your left as you go up the hill. We have 600+ parking slots here and this is where the VIA Shuttle Service will be located at. We still encourage carpooling and grabbing an Uber or Lyft!

FOUNDERS HALL SURFACE LOTS at 4119 Broadway (705 spaces). The Founders Hall surface lots can be accessed from either Hildebrand or Broadway.

INCARNATE WORD HIGH SCHOOL: Over 100 parking spots are available on the other side of 281. Simply walk across the UIW Skybridge over the highway to enter the event space at UIW.

SKILL EVENTS

WHATABURGER 5K RUN

Event Format

Four age divisions: (U30) (30-39) (40-49) (50+). There are no requirements for number of participants in age division. Only the top 8 runners will be recorded for team score. Each team must have at least four (4) runners in order to qualify for team points. Any team with less than four (4) runners registered will automatically get the minimum of 10 team points earned. All individual runners will still qualify for individual points earned.

Point System

100 points will be awarded to the 1st place team, 90 points will be awarded to the 2nd place team and points will move down incrementally by 10 until the 8th place team has been awarded 30 points. All teams that finish below 8th place will be awarded 10 points.

Individual Points

5, 4, and 3 points will be awarded to the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place male and female runners in each of the 4 age divisions.

Packet/Bib Pickup Date

Captains and/or participants will need to pickup their race bibs on race day.

ALTERMAN SOCCER KICKS

Event Format

One at a time, each member of the team will take 3 shots on a mini goal at each of 3 distances. Goals will be at distances of 10, 15 and 20 yards and will be worth 2, 4, and 6 points respectively.

Equipment

Ball is size 4, mini-goal is approximately 6'x3.5'x3.5'.

Point System

This skill event will award points based off the actual points scored during the competition and not utilize the 1st through 8th place scoring format. Please reference the scoring overview page for points earned for each distance.

CITI FOOTBALL THROW

Event Format

One at a time, each team member will throw 3 footballs at a target placed at distances of 5, 10, and 15 yards, and will be worth 5, 10 and 20 points respectively.

Equipment

Wilson Junior Size Football. 7' x 7' throwing net with three (3) throwing targets: Target is 25" long circumference/18.5" short circumference. Two (2) targets at 6ft in height, one (1) target at 3ft height.

Point System

This skill event will award points based off the actual points scored during the competition and not utilize the 1st through 8th place scoring format. Please reference the scoring overview page for points earned for each distance.

GOLF CHIPPING

Event Format

One at a time, team members will chip 5 balls from a distance of 40 yards into 3 progressively larger circles surrounding a flag. 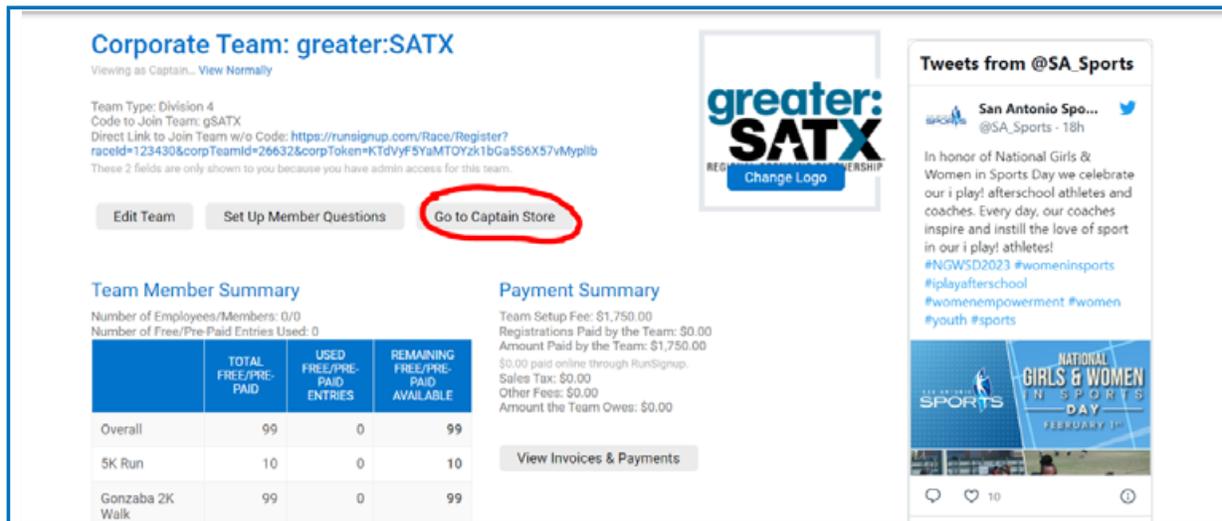

1. Click the Register Team button as indicated in the screenshot above. This will take you to the Team Captain Store page.

a. Please note that all captains and participants will be asked to create a RunSignUp account and will need to save their login credentials for admin and competition registration use.

2. Once you are on the Captain Store webpage which is displayed on page 33:

- a. Select the number of spaces you have/want in the appropriate zone.
- b. Please enter your specific assigned spaces that you have in the “Please include specific space locations” box.

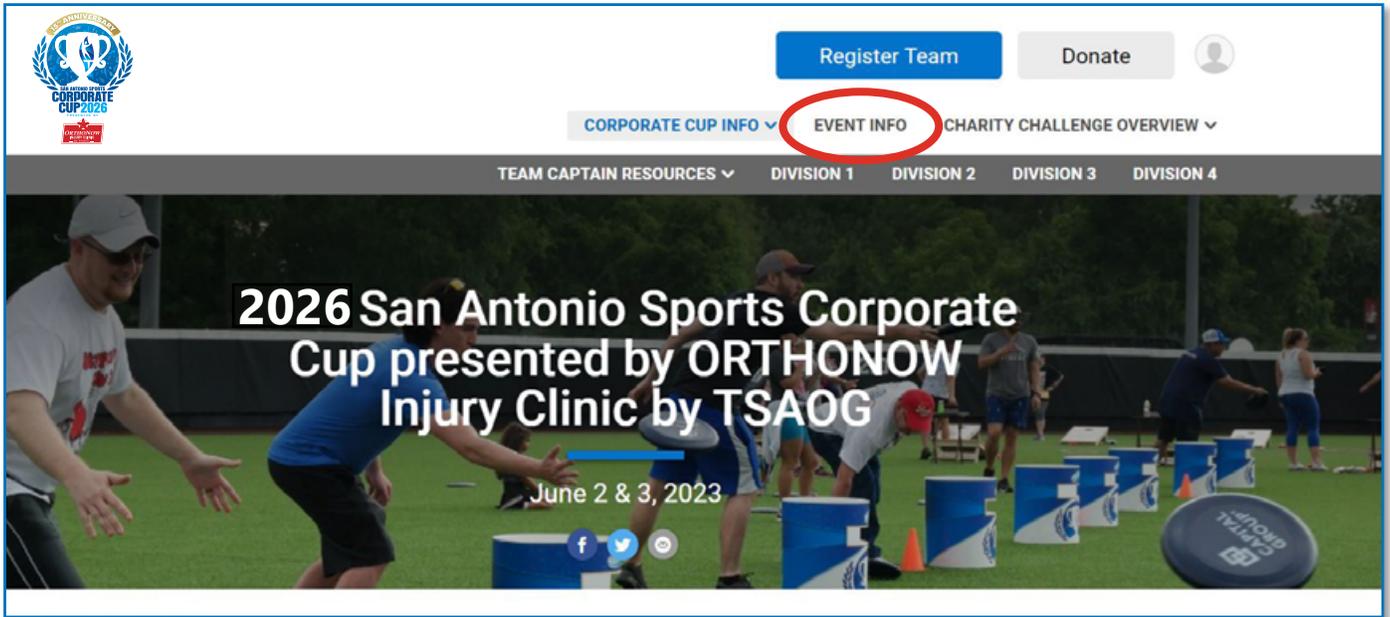
3. Tailgate ice and food orders

a. While on the team Captain Store page, scroll down to bottom of page and please select the number of ice bags you would like to pre-order. For food orders, captains will first be prompted to select and confirm the time you or a team representative will be coming to the concession area to pick-up your team’s order.
