MORE INFORMATION

What you need to know regarding the Rock the Bike Venue Area

It is prohibited to bring a knife, club or any other instrument, device or thing that is capable of inflicting serious physical harm. This does not apply to law enforcement officers or to canes, crutches or other similar devices used by persons who are visually or physically impaired.

No person shall bring any animal into the event area unless such animal is being or will be used by law enforcement officials in the performance of their duties, or as a guide dog or other handicap-assist animal, or is otherwise specifically authorized by the city of Troy,

No person shall engage in the act of writing, painting, chalking or otherwise permanently or temporarily defacing or marking on the public streets, sidewalks, alleys or other public areas in the event area.

No person shall use drones except as approved by the city for event documentation and marketing purposes only.

Whoever violates these conditions is guilty of a minor misdemeanor.

Tour de Donut moves to Troy

TROY — The city of Troy learned it had been tapped for the cycling enthusiast's most dunkworthy road race in the country in December 2016.

City officials announced the move to downtown Troy from its decade-long span of being held in the village of Arcanum.

Event creator Roger Bowersock, a former professional cyclist, said he and his family frequent the Troy historic downtown district, which is how they came to move the event from Darke County to Miami County.

"Troy is the community that is going to allow our event to continue to grow and offer the things our participants want and desire for the riding public and their family members," Bowersock said "With the city of Troy's help, the hotels that are being offered, additional outside activities, shopping for family members, we believe we can continue to grow this event."

Troy Mayor Michael Beamish welcomes the move to the city, a bronze medalist as a "Bike Friendly" community, awarded by the League of American Bicyclists.

"We expect a great crowd coming down to see the living room of our community in downtown Troy," Beamish said.

The Tour de Donut will start and end around the square of historic downtown Troy on Saturday, Sept. 16, 2017.

With the event moving to downtown Troy, the 2,000 number cap was increased to 3,000 in order to accommo-

STRAWBERRY DONUT GETS COVETED GLAZER SPOT

TROY — "Head Donut" and event creator Roger Bowersock said the 2017 Tour de Donut tour will be using Schulers Bakery in Springfield for its 12,000-plus glazed donuts. The Troy Strawberry Festival's fan favorite strawberry donuts, created by the Troy Music Boosters, will be the tour's famous "Glazer" donut.

"The band will be manning the glazer stop, which will make for a great experience for everyone," said Bowersock, who said the stop will be at the stadium where they make the doughnuts.

Bowersock noted that the Tour de Donut had tried to work with a local supplier though they required that they make all the doughnuts.

"We really liked the idea of adding the band's strawberry donut to the mix," he said. Another local connection to the tour will be Winan's Coffee + Chocolates, who will be providing coffee for participants at the Miami County Park District's Garby's Big Woods donut stop.

date the growing demand of interested cyclists who travel to this event from 30 states — including a rider from Alaska last year.

The Tour de Donut is a bicycle event in which participants' "ability to eat donuts is just as important as their ability to ride their bicycle."

In 2016, across all divisions, a total of 79 competitors joined the Dozen Club by eating 12 or more donuts. Each

donut they ate deducted 5 minutes from their finishing time.

Yasir Salem, who is ranked No. 9 in the world by Major League Eating, ate the most donuts of anyone in 2016. He ate 36 donuts in the men's 19-50 full race, down from his 44 in 2015 and a record 48 in 2014, when he competed in the longer Double D competition. Salem finished

in an adjusted time of negative-32:45.0.

During this timed bicycle event, riders visit donut stops along the course. For each donut the rider will eat (and keeps down), 5 minutes will be deducted from their ride time. The Glazer, a special donut stop, will return by popular demand. Each donut eaten at this stop is worth a 10-minute deduction in ride time. The Troy Music Boosters' strawberry donut, made famous by the Troy Strawberry Festival, has been chosen as this year's Glazer donut.

The Donut Mini, a 16-mile course, will return with one donut stop at Garbry's Big Woods. The Mini awards its own prizes and allows younger

riders and families to take part in the fun due to the shorter distance.

The 32-mile course, the Tour


de Donut, will offer two donut stops, one at Elizabeth Township Center and one at Garbry's Big Woods. And for the experienced cyclist, the Double D Challenge is a 64-mile ride with three donut stops, the two previous stops and the Indian

Creek Distillery. Prizes will be awarded for these courses in age group classes. Special awards will be given for the most donuts eaten, fastest time (without donuts), and the coveted golden Tour de Donut championship belt for the best adjusted "donut time."

A free children's event will take place at 8 a.m. on North Market Street. All children participating will receive a free T-shirt, finisher medal and unlimited donuts and milk courtesy of Orthopedic Associates of Southwest Ohio.

A Rock the Bike event, featuring entertainment will also be part of the weekend's events, as will many other events planned throughout the downtown area, including sidewalk sales, a movie, and children's events.

RULES FOR RIDERS



Tour de Donut bicycle riders are encouraged to know the rules of the road and event.

The roads used for the Tour de Donut will be open to vehicular traffic during the event. Riders must obey all traffic laws including stopping at stop signs and staying on the correct side of the road. No headphones or ear buds are allowed. It is illegal in Ohio.

Roads are marked with arrows with additional signage at major turns. Wear your helmet and keep it fastened always. Riders are encouraged to ride in a safe and predictable manner. Only pass on the left and be sure to announce your passing. If you stop along the route, get off the road as to not impede other riders.

Your timing chip must be attached to the seat post of your bicycle as a flag. Do not tape it to your frame. Your number must be worn on your body, it is your ticket into the rest stops and donut count keeper.

Line up at North Market Street may

begin after the kid's events have finished. Faster riders will be placed at the front to start the event. Your time will start once you cross the timing mats. There is no need to rush.

Donut stop rules

You can take out three donuts at a time. Your donuts must be counted as they are taken. No donuts are permitted to leave the donut stop enclosure If you are unable to finish a donut, please return to the donut counters for a recount. You must eat at least one donut to be eligible for awards.

Finish

After a rider crosses the finish line, they will enter the donut counter area. Riders must go through this area to have their donuts counted. To be eligible for awards, riders on the Double D must be finished by 1 p.m.; Full Donut riders must be finished by noon; and Mini Donut riders must finish by 10:30 a.m.



Festival to offer music, movie and more

Event part of Tour de Donuts weekend

TROY — While the 1979 film "Breaking Away" shows at the Mayflower Arts Theatre, live entertainment will entertain music lovers during the Rock the Bike Music Festival on Friday, Sept. 15.

The festival, which will top off the Tour de Donut weekend in downtown Troy, will feature cycling, music and food in celebration of the city hosting its first Tour de Donuts Challenge, which is moving to Troy from Darke County. The event is the product of a partnership involving Rocketship Sports, the city of Troy, Troy Main Street and the Miami County Visitor's Bureau.

Starring Dennis Christopher, "Breaking Away" is a coming-of-age comedy-drama centered on a group of Indiana teens

who have recently graduated from high school. Christopher's character, Dave, dreams of competitive bicycle racing. The four friends face opposition from all corners as they decide to make Dave's dreams come true in the university's annual bicycle endurance race.

The film will begin at 5:30 p.m. There is no ticket fee, but tickets will be available at the door on a first-come, first-served basis.

Meanwhile, live stage entertainment will begin at 5:45 p.m. with Corey Breth, followed by The Floorwalkers at 7 p.m.

Entertainment on Saturday, Sept. 16, will begin at 10:30 a.m., when zookeepers and handlers from the Columbus Zoo will introduce six to eight animals and speak about their individual habitats, status in the wild and conservation issues.

Downtown activities begin with 9 a.m. sidewalk sales and the Downtown Troy Farmers Market, and beer and wine sales will start at noon. In addition, downtown restaurants will be open throughout the day.

Musical acts slated to perform during the day include Ashley Martin, the Seventh Street Band, The Fries Band and the Eric Jerardi Band.

From 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., shuttles will be on hand to transport visitors to and from the WACO Fly-In and to Indian Creek Distillery, at no charge. WACO biplane rides will be available at the Fly-In until 5 p.m. for \$100 per person. The biplane will take two people up at a time.

Cory Breth — 5:45 p.m.

Blending sounds from folk, alternative, pop and soul, Breth crafts a style and sound that transcend the traditional castes of genre.

The Chillicothe native has had a passion for singing for as long as he can remember, starting with roles in elementary school musicals and continuing through his senior year of high school. It was during this time that Breth began experimenting with the guitar and honing his skills through casual performances for friends and family.

His passion for sharing his music has fueled his frenetic schedule during the last three years, each opportunity to perform live merely adding more fuel to his already brimming tank.

The Floorwalkers — 7 p.m.

Growing up together in the suburbs of Cleveland, The Floorwalkers played Little League baseball together as children. In high school, they formed a band and played music together from 2000 to 2004. After high school, part of the band moved to Columbus, traveling the Midwest as a trio and releasing a self-titled acoustic EP in 2005. By 2007, the whole band had relocated to Columbus.

Ashley Martin Band — 12:15 p.m.

Martin is a singer-songwriter from Dayton, born into a family where music was a basic part of life. She quickly found her place in her family's 75-piece gospel choir, belting her first solo at just 6 years old. At age 12, she was competing in vocal competitions and started her solo singing career at retirement homes and assisted living facilities. At 19, she attended Belmont University in Nashville and studied music business. After eight years of honing her craft as an artist, retiring from a rock band and declining an offer in the pop world, Martin now tours the country with her four-piece band. She has created a unique style all her own — a mix of country, rock and

This seasoned artist traveled thou-

sands of miles to perform over 500 live performances in the last three years. The band has opened for the likes of Brett Eldridge, The Band Perry, Tracey Lawrence, Dustin Lynch, Frankie Ballard, Trick Pony and Zac Brown Band. She released her third CD, "Take 2," in October 2016. Her latest single, "He's Mine," has generated more excitement than any of her previous works.

Seventh Street — 3 p.m.

Formed in May 2012, Seventh Street performs at festivals, music bars, and the occasional block party. Jason has fronted guite a few bands, like The Mod Rats and Plan B: Jimmy can be found iamming with Hidden Assets, Electrobek (aka Jakubek and friends), Clark Manson and BJ Brown; Matt's been - and is still known to be — an Alabastard, a Sellout, and a member of The Black Cigarettes; Wes spent some time with Rude Mude and serves as the missing link in Electrobek; Jon and Wes played in Zeo's Funkyard throughout the 90's. Jon also plays drums for Wiseblood and Electrobek.

The Fries Band — 5 p.m.

The Fries Band and their trio, A Side of Fries, have become known as the premier vocal band in the Dayton area. They focus on very tight three, four and five-part vocal harmonies that are primarily

Eric Jerardi Band - 7:30 p.m.

Jerardi's live shows are legendary all across markets in the United States. He has released six CDs since 1997 and has worked with some of the industry's best. From producer David Z (Prince, Fine Young Cannibals, Johnny Lang) to recording with Chuck Leavell (Rolling Stones, Allman Bros., Black Crowes), Jerardi is having the time of his life.

For the last few years, Jerardi has limited his rigorous touring schedule to take a step back and reflect. During this period, he has written his most compelling music to date.

After almost 15 years, he reconnected with Gary Gates, a longtime friend and polished bass player who performed on the "Had Enough" CD. Jerardi was also introduced to progressive rock drummer Adam Wheeler and the trio has developed a style of blues rock that is pushing the boundaries. This blend comes from Gates' experience in the iconic Dayton funk music scene of the 70's, and Wheeler's world-class ability, not only as an accomplished drummer, but a skilled keyboardist. On several tracks of the new material, Wheeler plays keys and drums at the same time, making The Eric Jerardi Band one of the most powerful blues rock trios around.






