

Things to Know

* Venue: Please note the *change in venue* from last year. BOOK IT! 2019 is at Jeffrey Trail Middle School in Irvine (not Orange Coast College).

* When to Arrive:

- Runners and Walkers: Check-in/registration table opens at 6:30am. Arrive by 7:00 so you can visit booths and participate in costume contest and race warm-up
- Exhibitors, Vendors, and Authors: Arrive 5:30 6:00 am. Plan to have your booth set up preferably by 6:30 before traffic of participants, 7:00 am at the latest.
- Volunteers: Assisteens and other volunteers, please arrive by 6:00 am for a quick volunteer meeting and your volunteer assignments

* What to Bring:

- Runners and Walkers: Literary costume, new book to donate if you'd like, sunscreen, and running shoes!
- Exhibitors, Vendors, and Authors: Table, chairs, canopy + your own supplies
- Volunteers: Assisteens shirt or ask for a BOOK IT! Shirt
- * Book Character Costume Contest: We are trying to grow BOOK IT! as a literary-themed run that celebrates reading. Kids and adults are encouraged to dress up (or wear a literary prop). Be at the start/finish line by 7:10am to participate. Author and costume contest sponsor Alane Adams will judge with Ethan's help trophies/prizes will be awarded!
- * Course Reminders: The 1K Fun Run is an untimed event that will start prior to the 5K/10 and go in the opposite direction, from the parking lot and around the track. After the costume contest and warm up (which will occur facing the start/finish line), 1K participants will be asked to turn around to start the fun run. 5K/10K timed events will start after the 1K is finished and will go from the parking lot out to Jeffrey Open Space Trail.
- * Pancake Breakfast: Everyone who purchased a pancake breakfast online or who donated to the online book drive will receive a voucher for a free pancake breakfast at the registration/check-in desk on race day. Pancake breakfasts can also be purchased at the event with cash only before or after the run. Thank you to Irvine Kiwanis Club for providing this breakfast and making the pancakes on site!

- * Scholastic & Authors: Scholastic, Once Upon a Storybook, and several authors will be at BOOK IT! to sell their books and help celebrate children's books. Purchase books, donate them at the ECBC booth, and then receive a voucher for a free pancake breakfast!
 - Scholastic: Stop by the Scholastic booth to spin the wheel to select a book to donate. And snap a picture with Clifford the Big Red Dog!
 - <u>Authors</u>: Visit the author area to purchase a signed book to keep or to donate, to listen to a story, and for photo opportunities with authors. Authors include Sheri Fink, Mara James, Derek Taylor Kent, Adriene Madden, Jen Olsen, Dan Paley, and Susie Schaeffer.
- * Activities for Kids: In addition to visiting the Scholastic and author booths, there are several activities that may appeal to kids. They include:
 - Bounce House for kids only please
 - Photo Booth with fictional character props
 - <u>Handprint Wall</u> to show support for books for hospitalized kids, with child's nomination of a favorite book to be purchased for CHOC patients. We're want EVERY CHILD at the event to get his/her hand on the wall!
 - <u>Care Cards</u> activity for kids to go in oncology patient book boxes: Visit Girl Scout Troop #3115 booth to participate!
- **First Aid Station**: There will be a first aid station with a certified EMT in the exhibitor area for the duration of the event.



BOOK IT 2019 Parking Plan

- 1. There are more than 250 parking spaces at Jeffrey Trail Middle school. (combination of existing parking spaces and parking on basketball courts)
- 2. Parking for this event is limited to Jeffrey Trail Middle School (155 Visions)

No parking is allowed in the lots south of Jeffrey Trail (the Cypress Community Center or to the North at Trabuco Center.)

3. Parking spaces at Jeffrey Trails Middle school and on the basketball Courts are reserved for the BOOK IT Run participants.


Please make sure you park in only these two areas. All vehicles should enter from the Visions entrance. Please fill the spaces on the basketball courts first and do not park in spaces reserved for the church that meets at the school later that morning.

- 4. Once you have parked, head over to the outdoor basketball court area to check-in and get your bib and T-shirt and visit the expo area.
- 3. At 6:00 am, the Roosevelt entrance to the parking lot will be closed to ensure the safety of participants heading to and from the trail.

Parking monitors in orange vests will direct traffic to the entrance and exits on Visions. The Roosevelt Rd entrance will be reopened when all of the runners have completed their run.

Last year, the inaugural BOOK IT! Book Drive resulted in 300 new books collected on race day and \$7200 from the online book drive, funding a total of approximately 1000 new books.



About Ethan & Choco's Book Club



PROVIDING HOSPITALIZED KIDS WITH HIGH-QUALITY BOOKS AND READ-ALOUD EXPERIENCES





The goal of Ethan & Choco's Book Club (ECBC) is to make access to books and reading part of the everyday care that kids' receive at CHOC Children's Hospital.

Currently, ECBC is doing the following at CHOC:

- Offering bedside reading by trained volunteers to patients, via ECBC's "Read-Aloud Wagon" that boasts high-quality literature for all ages.
- 2. Giving away new books to patients in isolation via ECBC's mobile Gifting Library Cart.
- 3. Distributing books to patients at monthly parties in the hospital lobby and in CHOC's Outpatient Infusion Center.
- 4. Gifting a "Read-Think+Thrive Box" (minilibrary of 10 new books and crafting supplies) to new cancer diagnoses at CHOC.
- 5. Hosting BOO-KS for Treats annually on Halloween, where CHOC patients and siblings trick-or-treat for new, high-quality Halloween books.

Ethan's big dream is to someday build a permanent, comprehensive lending library at CHOC; offer a read aloud to every patient every day in the hospital; and also to be able to give a "Read+Think+Thrive Box" to every new cancer diagnosis in the U.S.

Ethan's Story

Ethan was diagnosed with High-Risk Acute
Lymphoblastic in October 2014 at 7 1/2 years old and
finished treatment in February 2018. While being
treated at CHOC, Ethan noticed that books and
reading were missing from patients' hospital
experience, especially the oncology patients on the
5th floor. Along with his mom, he founded ECBC in
December 2015 to make sure that hospitalized kids
receive the tremendous cognitive and social benefits
of reading that help kids to thrive through treatment
and beyond.
