ROUTES – The course is a 20.6 mile paved course of your choosing. The route must include at least 1000 feet elevation.

WEATHER – If you are riding at Asaayi, expect summer conditions. While the race is at 7500-8000 feet elevation, the temperatures are still likely to be in the 70's and 80's. Cloud cover, wind or precipitation (even monsoons, of course) are possible in August. It is advisable to look ahead at the forecast a few days before the race, checking Navajo, NM or Crystal, NM
