

# CHATTANOOGA SYMPHONY & OPERA

Beethoven's 5(th)K | Suggested Route in Chattanooga



**START** at the Tivoli Theatre. You'll see the temporary CSO office (wave hello!). Walk toward the James Building in the direction of Martin Luther King Blvd.

On the corner of E MLK and Broad Street, you'll see the historic Read House that was recently remodeled in the style of the roaring 20's. Turn right onto East Martin Luther King Blvd. (toward the interstate) and then turn right onto Chestnut.





Welcome to the West Village! Continue down Chestnut and look both ways when you cross 4th Street. Wave to our friends at the Creative Discovery Museum!



About 2.5 blocks past the museum, take a right on the sidewalk that passes in front of the Tennessee Aquarium. If you feel adventurous, check out the wading stream and various outdoor features...



Head toward the aquarium building with a pyramid on top - toward Market Street. Cross Market and head up 1st Street. It can be a bit steep! After about two blocks, you'll see the columns of the Hunter Museum for American Art.

Turn left onto the Walnut Street walking bridge, and walk to the end. You're walking over the Tennessee river!



At the end of a bridge, take a left onto Frazier Avenue. Welcome to the Northshore neighborhood!



When you get to Clumpies Creamery (yum!), look across the street at the corner of Frazier and Woodlawn. Here you'll find the Chattanooga Public Art installation, "Chattanooga Music Man" playing his fiddle.



Turn around and head back the way you came, passing the entrance to the walking bridge. Walk to the next block and turn right onto Tremont Street.



You'll walk past the Chattanooga Theatre Centre (more friends to wave to!) and the parking lot. At the end of the road, you'll see another Chattanooga Public Art Installation: "Blue Boy Pull Toy #1" - it's pretty hard to miss a rhino in the street!



After admiring the rhino, head down the sidewalk that leads into the park - not the one immediately by the river.

Follow the path...



...until you reach another Chattanooga Public Art installation: "Heavy Metal," which is a sculptural piece created jointly by Jim Collins and Jonathan McNair.



Continue following the sidewalk across River Street (be careful making your way through the parking lot) and find your way up the stairs to the entrance of the Walnut Street bridge.





Walk back across the bridge and enjoy the view!

At the end of the bridge, keep walking down Walnut Street, passing the Edwin Hotel on your way. If you've got some time, check out some of the incredible and unique art housed in the Edwin common areas.



After three blocks, take a right onto 4th Street. Then, you'll turn left on Broad Street after three more blocks.
