

# Richmond Road Runners Club - Meeting Minutes - September 14, 2022

### Opening remarks, ground rules and welcome guests – Rainey Niklawski, President

Planned out two routes (6.19 miles and 16.19km) to experience historical landmarks of 400 years of Black history in Richmond. Everyone is welcome to join the finish line festivities kicking off at 9am Saturday morning. An Oscar nominated actor will be at the event that you can run with.

#### **Review of Races**

## Ashland Half Marathon - August 27 (Michael George)

- Race went very well and had good weather. There was almost a new course record.
- Michael would appreciate more help from RRRC members, lots of good help from Sports Backers.

# **Preview of upcoming Races**

### Das Bier Run - September 24 (Mike Gholson)

- Consensus is that the race will be moving forward. 15 teams currently registered (60 runners). Right now at about the break even point. Will not be buying race-specific bibs, will use RRRC numbers with chips. A beverage ticket will be added to the bibs.
- Hanover County currently has no police officers signed up for the race (no police will mean no race). Will not know anything more about police availability until next week
- Extra money was required for insurance of Hanover County Sheriff's Office.

# Twilight 5k - September 25 (Lily Grace Hester, Bill Kelly, Rosie Schutte)

Update on race and the Youth Running Camp.

- Bill and Rosie are the advisors for the race; Lily Grace is directing this race for a school project for her leadership program. Hopefully, the Twilight 5k will be an annual event to support the running camp. The Twilight 5k will not be an official RRRC race this year, but Bill would like for the club to look at the success of this year's race and consider it for future years as a club race.
- Currently have raised over \$7,000 in income (revenue and donations) with expenses around \$2,500.
- The goal is for this race to provide the funding for the RRRC Summer Youth Running Camp for middle schoolers in future years.
- The running camp directly supports the RRRC mission statement to support running and healthy lifestyles in the Richmond area.
- Rosie and Bill gave a presentation about the running camp's history.
  - This was the third year for the running camp, and each year has been a success. The running camp is free for all participants.
  - To date: 245 campers have participated from as far as Stafford and Northumberland Counties. 56 coaches have participated (certified coaches, professional athletes, college and high school coaches, high school runners); 24 speakers have come to the running camp over the past three years.
  - o Looking forward RRRC can support the camp through financial support, insurance coverage built into the annual budget, and member volunteer coordination.
  - o Camp is held at Robious Middle School, and the insurance goes through Chesterfield County's Parks and Recreation Department.
  - o Bill and Rosie are looking for the club's support (particularly club member in-person support) to help with the running camp long term so that the running camp will continue successfully in the future. Looking for 2-4 club people to act as "interns" next year, assisting Rosie and Bill and hopefully leading the camp in future years when Rosie and Bill step down.
- The Twilight 5k was added to RRRC's insurance policy.
- There was discussion led by Michael and Marcy George about why the club's insurance

policy is being used for a student's race that is not an official RRRC race. The RRRC Executive Board made a decision to add the race to the club's insurance policy. In the future, similar decisions (executive orders) will be sent out to the board, and policies will be enacted to clarify what it takes for a race to become a club race (such as how far in advance a race needs to be approved by the club).

# Capital Trial 10 Miler - October 29 (Mary Kwiatkowski and Michael George)

• Registrations are double what they were this time last year. Police have been contacted. Using the same bib layout as last year. Big thing is we need volunteers – we need 60 total and have about 12 now.

# TRex Run - November 13 (Donnie Lane)

• As of today, 144 people have registered and many from outside of the Richmond area. Likely will not pursue official Guinness World Record status due to cost.

### Wegman's Turkey Trot - November 24 (Ben Watcher/Michael George)

• The University of Richmond does not want to commit the police, custodial, and landscaping staff for the race this year. Michael George is pursuing other location options. Looking into Bryan Park again this year. West Creek was mentioned as a possible location, but Michael said the Goochland Police are very strict on where a race can be held in that area so it is not a viable option. Mara mentioned that starting/finishing at the Diamond or City Stadium could be an option. Michael mentioned that the race location needs to be central to the Richmond area when considering options.

#### Toy Run - December 11 (Kirk Millikan)

Planning for the race on Sunday, December 11th is ongoing. The 5k will be the season-ending race for Girls on the Run of Greater Richmond, who anticipate 200+ girls with 200+ running buddies. Registration will open on October 1st. Brainstorming a race name to include both "Toy Run" and "Girls on the Run" - potentially will use "RRRC Toy Run 5k in partnership with Girls on the Run". Looking into a presenting sponsor for the race to help defer costs. Need to discuss with RRRC board timing for the race - Girls on the Run is fine not using chips on their bibs/not having official finish times, but I am unsure if having some participants with chips and some without would create a timing headache.

- Kirk asked if race directors need to pay for music if a sponsor is the one playing music. Leigh Anne said the fee for playing music would still be needed.
- If everyone has similar looking bibs, it is hard to know who is chip timed and who is not.
- Need to determine if GOTR will have their own bibs or perhaps no bibs at all. If GOTR can provide their own bibs, it would be easier for RRRC timing and finish line staff.
- Mara mentioned that for liability, RRRC needs to know names with bib numbers. Also, GOTR participants need to sign our waiver to run our race (even if they have a separate waiver for the race).

### **Contract Races**

• Shawn said the club is getting a lot of requests recently including three clock rentals.
