Review of Races

Bear Creek Lake 10 Mile Trail Run - March 12, 2023 (Dave Trump & Ralph Gibbs)

We think we had a highly successful race — at least there were lots of smiling finishers. The weather cooperated for most of the runners, but a few finished in light snow. The trail overall was in good shape. Willis River Trail provided single-track challenges and a great water hazard (detour option provided). Our course changes made the last half of the race even faster than in past years. Having a course sweeper was a great help. It was a RRCA State Championship race: our state rep Grattan Garbee ran the race and handed out the awards for us.

209 runners registered for the in-person race: 168 runners checked in and completed the race. Seven (7) runners registered for and reported times for the virtual event. As expected, participation was down from the 2021 event. Interestingly, half of the registrants were not RRRC members. The status as a RRCA State

Championship event may have contributed to the shift, but there's more opportunity to market the race in the Lynchburg and Charlottesville markets.

The race made a profit of \$461.00 per our calculations. See the attached post-race budget worksheet. We do plan to raise the race fee to \$45.00/\$35.00 next year since per item expenses were higher this year.

We got the shirt count right (only 2 left over). We made a lot of runners happy by handing out all of the leftover race shirts from the past three race. One less box in the storeroom.

We've looked at options and for 2024 propose hosting the race on Sunday, February 25. This avoids the DST and the new Sports Backers half marathon weekend, while still staying away from major hunting seasons. We're assuming that Sweetheart will be on February 11.
